



**ETNA CEMETERY**  
Sawyers Bar Road  
Etna, CA

The Etna Cemetery District was formed July 6, 1938 by the Siskiyou County Board of Supervisors; consisting of Gordon Jacobs, C.F. Pendleton, Fred Burton Sr., W.T. Davidson and Charles Farrington. The first Etna Cemetery Board was appointed by the Board of Supervisors; Ormand Smith, H.C. Eller and August Dannenbrink.

The Etna Cemetery includes a fenced area of about 10 acres. The portion covering both sides of the central avenue and nearest the county road is the public section. The portion, next to the hills on the north side was established by the Independent Order of Odd Fellows and to the south by the Masonic Lodge. The site was selected in 1866 but was not laid off into lots, walks and avenues until 1871. Also, at this time it was enclosed by a substantial board fence. The early monuments were made in Etna from marble procured near here but it proved to not withstand the weathering as well as that from Italy, Vermont and New Hampshire. Consequently, the Etna Marble Works ceased working.

The district has purchased more land behind the current cemetery to be used as needed in the future and has all the records on a computer program.

### Prices and Information

If you live in the district - \$450.00 per lot.  
If you live out of district Lot - \$875.00 per lot.

Lots - 5' wide by 10' long. A lot can be used for 1 - 2 caskets, 1 casket and 3 urns or 6 urns. The lots are sold in 'as is' condition.

The lots must be paid in full at time of purchase and you will receive a 'Deed Receipt'.

Restrictions - No glass containers, no planting and no cement work without approval of Cemetery Caretaker Arrangements and assistance for ALL burials are necessary and provided by the manager/caretaker:
